Santarsiero Bill Threatens Girls' Sports and Safety

Sen. Steve Santarsiero (D), sponsors Senate Bill 150, ironically named "The Fairness Act." This bill aims to change the definition of sex discrimination in PA public accommodations to include gender identity and expression, which includes education. It passed the PA House (HB 300). Should this bill pass, it would prove devastating for girls' sports and spaces such as restrooms.



This comes in the wake of Pennsylvania Human Relations Commission (PHRC) announcing new regulations, expanding the definitions of 'sex,' 'religious creed,' and 'race,' under the PHRA. Under the new regulation, 'sex' is to include pregnancy status, childbirth status, breastfeeding status, sex assigned at birth, gender identity or expression, affectional or sexual orientation, and differences in sex development.



Pennridge Democrats Mount Opposition to Bathrooms Based on Biological Sex

Following the Pennridge School Board's May adoption of a bathroom and locker room policy based on biological

sex, Pennridge Democrats mounted a late, but loud, opposition. At the board's June meeting, public commenters threatened to organize lawsuits against the district, sharing social media contact information in public comment and offering to assist others in getting "legal recourse" to force mixed-sex bathrooms and locker rooms. Democrats were virtually silent on this issue prior to the policy's passing last month, however.
